from the Pastor's (messy) desk

Matthew 23:1-12

<u>1</u> Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples: <u>2</u>."The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. <u>3</u> So you must be careful to do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach. <u>4</u> They tie up heavy, cumbersome loads and put them on other people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to lift a finger to move them.

<u>5</u> "Everything they do is done for people to see: They make their phylacteries wide and the tassels on their garments long; <u>6</u> they love the place of honor at banquets and the most important seats in the synagogues;

<u>7</u> they love to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to be called 'Rabbi' by others.

<u>8</u> "But you are not to be called 'Rabbi,' for you have one Teacher, and you are all brothers. <u>9</u> And do not call anyone on earth 'father,' for you have one Father, and he is in heaven. <u>10</u> Nor are you to be called instructors, for you have one Instructor, the Messiah.

<u>11</u> The greatest among you will be your servant. <u>12</u> For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

This is a scripture from the lectionary for November 5, when I will not be with you. Perhaps you'll hear a larger explanation of this text. I want to deal with the last couple of verses. It speaks of acting appropriately on our faith. We are not to demand honors. We are to be humble.

You see, those who seek exaltation, who want to "puff themselves up", will find that they are not as important as they think. They will face humility. But if we humble ourselves to serve, we will find that we are in partnership with God as we fulfill Christ's ministries.

I am proud to be asked to fill in as your Pastor for a short while. Because I believe we are already in partnership with Jesus in his ministries, as we are tasked with these ministries in Matthew 25. (Matthew 25:31-46; look it up and read it. It's good Bible study for you.) We can feel the satisfaction that we are fulfilling this partnership with Christ.

My goal, over the next couple of months, is to make you realize how well you are serving your Lord, and how exciting a congregation we'll be to someone new, who is looking for a congregation to lead that will be making them proud. And I know your leadership is planning the same things.

It is --- or it can be --- an exhilarating time for us all. Let's make the most of it. Put these plans and opportunities on your calendar, so you can be here to support your church as it moves boldly into tomorrow.

While I will not be with you November 5, I will be celebrating a joyous occasion, as I conduct the marriage service for my granddaughter, Alexa Roggenkamp and Jesse Greenstein, in Washington, D. C. While it will not be a full blended service, it will pay homage to some traditions of the Jewish faith. The marriage will be finalized by the breaking of the glass, and the joyous shouts of *Mazel Tov*.



Lauren had the cutest pumpkin "mummy" craft that the kids enjoyed! The finished products were


